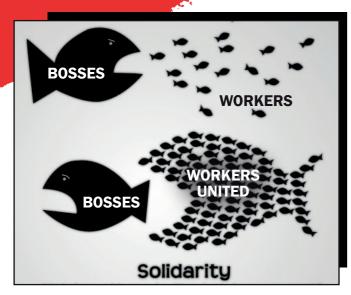

Did you know, your boss didn't give you the wages and conditions you enjoy today?
Union members fought for them.

In 2000 Electricians in construction were paid \$17 per hour \$1.50 less than labourers. From 2000 onwards, the ETU rebuilt our trade and our Enterprise Bargaining Agreements (EBA's), workers like you stood up for their trade, their licence and their futures. By 2003 the ETU and its members won a 36-hour week and increased the hourly rate for Electricians to \$22.50, a rate that was above all other trades.

From 2003 – 2018 ETU members continue working to maintain decent wages and conditions through strengthening our EBA's. However, we have noticed over the past five years that more and more companies are moving in and tendering for jobs at lower and lower non EBA rates, undercutting your wages and conditions.

Undercutting on the basis of paying lower wages and conditions creates a race to the bottom where good EBA companies are squeezed out and your trade is being degraded. When workers accept lower rates of pay and inferior conditions they are accelerating the race to the bottom.

Don't look back in five years and wonder why you can't make ends meet and why your pay packet continues to shrink, **stand up now**.

By joining your Union, we all have more power to create a level playing field for all companies, providing certainty and transparency by ensuring all wages and conditions are governed by one set of rules.

Our EBA's are the cornerstone of our trade, you can't negotiate the best conditions by yourself, we are always stronger together, our EBA hourly rate as at Nov 2018 is \$49.21

The ETU works with industry bodies and employers to ensure apprenticeships are available for Queenslanders before overseas guest workers.

#### Some of the recent attacks on your trade that have been resisted by the ETU

- o The attempt to water down the electrical apprenticeship time from 4 years to 1 year.
- o The attempts to reclassify electrical work to general hand and other work.
- o The consistent threats to the industry from overseas workers, brought in on sham skill shortages being paid substandard wages and conditions.
- The attempts to take away one on one learning for apprentices.
- o The removal of the ETU representative on Electrical Safety committees by the LNP Newman Government.
- o Con<mark>sta</mark>nt attempts to water down standards.
- The disgraceful conduct by some employers who exploit local and overseas workers on solar farms.
- o The ABCC and the Code being used to shut down legitimate health and safety campaigns.
- The relentless attacks on working people by the chaotic LNP federal government who care more about their job than yours.
